ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Phase 1 complete. Phase 2 East Kellogg is in design, Government gulch will hold off for road construction in 2025, Phase 3 plans are under way for investigations this year

Government Gulch EDA Design update from Felicia Cassidy of Alta

Final design with additional length in progress, additional work on grant for construction underway

Kellogg Levee Report from Felicia Cassidy of Alta

NEW BUSINESS

Consideration on Kellogg Public Library's Little Libraries Project

Install "little libraries" at Kellogg City Park and Riverside Park. These will be stocked with books culled from the library's general collection. It will be like "take a book, leave a book". Library is asking for assistance from Public Works crew to place the book cabinets.

Consideration on Silver Hoops Event (Fee Waiver & Street Closure)

Mercado asked Chief Twidt if he was good with the street closure proposal. Chief is not in favor, as that would create some traffic flow problems. Mayor Pro Tem Douglas suggested breaking the approval into two motions.

Councilmember Mercado motioned to waive the event fees. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Cobb. Motion carried.

Councilmember Cardenas motioned to leave the decision of street closure to Public Works and Police. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Mercado. Motion carried.

Consideration on Government Gulch Right-of-Way Transfer from DEQ

Right-of-Way is required to be transferred from DEQ to City of Kellogg in order to proceed with grant application for EDA grant.

Councilmember Mercado motioned to accept the transfer. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Cardenas. Motion carried.

Approving Mayor or Council President to Sign EDA Government Gulch Construction Application
