MINUTES OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

Sept 11, 2024

At 6:00 P.M. the meeting was called to order by Mayor Rod Plank.

Ron Mercado led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Plank asked that a moment of silence be observed to honor the victims of the 9/11 attacks.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Ordinance 629- Camping on Public Property

Councilmember Douglas motioned to open the public hearing. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Mercado. Motion carried.

This hearing is being held to take public comments on changes to allow KPD to better regulate camping on public property within Kellogg city limits. Chief Twidt explained that each summer we have at least one instance of someone camping on city property. This creates excessive trash and other complaints from the public. Councilmember Mercado asked about signage and it was suggested that we have a larger notice posted in the City Park with a complete list of rules. Chief Twidt and Planner Miller stated that the ordinance will better outline penalties for noncompliance.

No public comment was received. Councilmember Mercado motioned to close the public hearing. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Douglas. Motion carried.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Andy Helkey from IDEQ gave an update on future environmental remediation of the Mountain View Park area. Project could start by spring of 2025. It has to go through CDA Tribe approval, but with high risk to public health if not remediated, it can be overridden by DEQ. DEQ and Kellogg Public Works staff will visit the site soon to discuss needs.

OLD BUSINESS

FEMA update on LOMR Mapping from Felicia Cassidy with Alta

Application is with FEMA and awaiting review. FEMA had a change in the contractor assigned to the LOMR review. On August 15, 2024, Alta received an email from Vincent Hough on behalf of

FEMA identifying himself as the new contractor that is reviewing the LOMR application. Vincent is with CDM Smith. CDM Smith took over the contract from TetraTech. On August 29th, 2024, Alta received another email from Vincent letting us know August 29 was his last day and a different analyst will be assigned the case. Derek replied to the regional lead, Casey Martin on September 3, requesting a status on the review.

DEQ Stormwater Project Phase 2 and 3 from Felicia Cassidy with Alta

Phase 2 is in design for spring bidding. Phase 3 investigation is underway. Finding non-conventional pipe types and sizes, plus debris, is slowing down video investigations.

Kellogg Levee Preliminary Engineering from Felicia Cassidy with Alta

This is pending evaluation by Army Corps of Engineers. The USACE contact, Travis Ball, moved to Idaho in July. Derek will see if he is available to visit the levee with us and see if there are USACE funding options.

NEW BUSINESS

Consideration on Ordinance 629 Camping on Public Property

Councilmember Douglas moved to read the Ordinance by title only. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Cobb. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE NO. 629 CAMPING ON PUBLIC PROPERTY

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KELLOGG, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, AMENDING TITLE 6 POLICE REGULATIONS, CHAPTER 5 GENERAL OFFENSES, ADDING A NEW SECTION, 6-5-31: CAMPING ON PUBLIC PROPERTY TO KELLOGG CITY CODE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Kellogg, Shoshone County, Idaho, that Kellogg City Code be amended as follows:

Section 1. Title 6 Police Regulations, Chapter 5 General Offenses, is amended by adding a new section, 6-5-31 to read:

6-5-31: CAMPING ON PUBLIC PROPERTY

A. Definitions

CAMPING:

- Setting up or remaining on a site for the purpose of establishing or maintaining a temporary or permanent place of dwelling, lodging, residence, or living accommodation, or otherwise being in or adjacent to a tent or sleeping bag, or atop and/or covered by materials such as bedroll, blanket, cardboard, newspaper, or the like, or inside some temporary shelter.
- 2. Utilizing a tent or other temporary structure for the storage of personal belongings.

TEMPORARY STRUCTURE: Recreational vehicle, camper, tent, tarp, trailer, lean-to, vehicle, or other non-permanent assembly.

- B. Uses Restricted
- No person shall, as above described, camp, reside or occupy, in any manner or fashion, whether within a closed vehicle, van, camper, trailer or within a tent or other temporary movable structure or other contrivance, on any city street or public property within the City of Kellogg.
- 2. (Reserved for additional restrictions)
- C. Exceptions
- Persons receiving an Event or Activity Request, Facilities Reservation, or other permits that allow camping on public property from the City of Kellogg Clerk's Office.
- Uses commonly accepted to be associated with the use of a public park on a temporary basis, during normal hours of
 operations, in conjunction with the recreational use of such park or pavilion.
- D. Fines and Penalties
- 3. A first violation of this section is an infraction punishable by a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). A second or subsequent violation shall be a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of no less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for any one offense, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding six (6) months or by both such fine and imprisonment. Every day there is a violation shall constitute a separate violation/offense.

Section 2. Severability. This ordinance is hereby declared to be severable. Should any portion of this ordinance be declared invalid by court or competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect and shall be read to carry out the purpose(s) of the ordinance before the declaration of partial invalidity.

Section 3. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions. All provisions of the current Kellogg Municipal Code, or ordinance of the City of Kellogg which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KELLOGG, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 628 ENTITLED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2024: CORRECTING A CLERICAL ERROR IN THE TITLE AND SUM STATED IN SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE 628, NOTHING ELSE WILL CHANGE THEREIN.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Kellogg, Shoshone County, Idaho.
