These amendments correct and clarify the previous ordinance.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 634 AMENDMENTS TO PARKING REGULATIONS

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KELLOGG, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, AMENDING TITLE 10: TRAFFIC REGULATIONS, CHAPTER 4 PARKING REGULATIONS, SECTION 10-2-13: STOPPING, STANDING, OR PARKING IN SPECIFIED PLACES; REPEALING SECTIONS 10-2-13 D. ALL NIGHT PARKING PROHIBITED, AND 10-4-1: PARKING TIME LIMIT; ADDING A SECTION: 10-4-5: IMPLEMENTATION AND MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Kellogg, Shoshone County, Idaho, that Kellogg City Code be amended as follows:

Section 1. Title 10 Traffic Regulations, Chapter 4 Parking Regulations, is hereby amended to read:

10-2-13: STOPPING STANDING, OR PARKING IN SPECIFIED PLACES:

10-4-1: PURPOSE:

It is the purpose of this chapter to alleviate traffic and parking congestion caused by owners and operators of vehicles who allow or cause their vehicles to stand, stop or park for unreasonably long periods of time upon the most congested streets of the city, which thus impedes the flow of traffic. (Ord. 396, 1-12-1994)

10-4-1: PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION 1

(Rep. by Ord. 396, 1-12-1994)

1 2. For violations and penalties, see sections 10-2-17 and 10-2-18 of this title.

10-4-2: EVASION UNLAWFUL:

It shall be unlawful for the owner or operator of a vehicle to allow or cause the vehicle to be in violation of this chapter for the purpose of evading any time limit prescribed herein. (Ord. 396, 1-12-1994) 10-4-3: PARKING SPACE TO BE MARKED:

The chief of police shall have lines or markings painted upon the curb or street designating the parking space and each vehicle shall park within said lines or markings. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle across any such line or marking, or park a vehicle in such a position that it shall not be entirely within the space designated by such lines or markings. (Ord. 267, 2-7-1973, eff. 2-15-1973) 10-4-4: SEASONAL PARKING LIMITATIONS:

- A. It is unlawful for a person to park or leave standing any recreational vehicle, camper or trailer on any public street, park, avenue, alley or public way in the City between November 1 through March 31. Violation of this section shall be subject to the penalties set forth in 10-2-17 of the Kellogg Municipal Code. (Ord. 614, 11-11-2020)

  B. Overnight Parking: Between November 1 and March 31, no owner or operator of a vehicle shall allow or cause the vehicle to stop,
- stand or park on any street specified by signs, markings, and other indicators posted by the city, except for those vehicles operated by law enforcement, emergency response vehicles, and those directed by law enforcement.

C. (Reserved)

10-4-5: IMPLEMENTATION AND MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES:

When, by this chapter, any parking time limit is imposed or parking is prohibited on designated streets or parts of streets, city personnel shall erect and maintain appropriate signs or traffic markings giving notice thereof, and no such regulations shall be effective unless such signs or traffic markings are in place at the time of any alleged violation. City personnel are authorized to place and maintain appropriate signs or traffic markings to indicate standing or parking regulations,

and such traffic markings shall designate the zones and shall have the meanings set forth in this subsection.

- Red means no stopping, standing or parking at any time.
   Yellow means no stopping, standing or parking except as designated by appropriate signs or traffic markings.
   When appropriate signs or traffic curb markings have been erected or placed according to this subsection, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in any zone contrary to the provisions of this chapter.

Section 2. Severability. This ordinance is hereby declared to be severable. Should any portion of this ordinance be declared invalid by court or competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect and shall be read to carry out the purpose(s) of the ordinance before the declaration of partial invalidity.

Section 3. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions. All provisions of the current Kellogg Municipal Code, or ordinance of the City of Kellogg which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KELLOGG, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, AMENDING TITLE 3: DEPARTMENTS, REPEALING SECTION 3-1-3: EX OFFICIO POLICE JUDGE TO COMPLY WITH IDAHO STATUTE 1-103; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Kellogg, Shoshone County, Idaho, that Kellogg City Code be amended as follows:

Section 1. Title 3 Departments, Chapter 1 Police Department, Section 3-1-3: Ex Officio Police Judge is hereby repealed through the following amendment to read:

Repeal. Ordinance No. 203, codifying and compiling ordinances, Section 3-1-3, enacted November 16, 1961, is repealed.

Section 2. Severability. This ordinance is hereby declared to be severable. Should any portion of this ordinance be declared invalid by court or competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect and shall be read to carry out the purpose(s) of the ordinance before the declaration of partial invalidity.

Section 3. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions. All provisions of the current Kellogg Municipal Code, or ordinance of the City of Kellogg which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
