> ORDINANCE NO. 636 REPEALING TITLE 6, CHAPTER 2, SECTION 6-1-2: CONCEALED WEAPONS

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KELLOGG, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, AMENDING TITLE 6: POLICE REGULATIONS, REPEALING SECTION 6-1-2: CONCEALED WEAPONS TO CORRESPOND WITH IDAHO CODE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Kellogg. Shoshone County, Idaho, that Kellogg City Code be

Section 1. Title 6 Police Regulations, Chapter 2 Fire Arms, Concealed Weapons, Section 6-1-2: Concealed weapons is hereby repealed through the following amendment to read:

6-1-2: CONCEALED WEAPONS:

Repealed by Ordinance No. 637 to correspond with Idaho Code Title 18. Chapter 33 as amended.

Section 2. Severability. This ordinance is hereby declared to be severable. Should any portion of this ordinance be declared invalid by court or competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect and shall be read to carry out the purpose(s) of the ordinance before the declaration of partial invalidity.

Section 3. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions. All provisions of the current Kellogg Municipal Code, or ordinance of the City of Kellogg which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.
